Great news! We are close to the completion of needed Jericho Library building updates and repairs, all being paid for with existing library capital funds.

Our progress to date includes the added safety of a new guardrail and streamlined center island in the rear parking lot, and updates to the theater which include new carpeting, aisle lights, additional safety railings and comfortable seating. We look forward to Jericho patrons enjoying many future performances and events in this space. Phase two includes replacement of the old leaking windows throughout the building and the second floor computer area expansion with additional seating for patrons.

Our continued goal is to maintain efficient and effective operations while providing the high-quality programs and services that are important to the Jericho community. With this objective in mind, the Jericho Library Board of Trustees respectfully proposes a budget for the 2024-2025 fiscal year that falls under the tax cap and reflects a 1.63% increase to the tax levy. The budget is available for viewing on our website or a copy can be picked up at the Reference Desk.

Our friendly and helpful staff are ready to assist you to make your library visit easy and rewarding. Let us help you navigate our building, access the information and resources you need, provide you with your next great read and help you further your pursuit of lifelong learning. 

Tennessee Williams
Monday, May 6th at 2:00 PM



Tennessee Williams, along with Eugene O'Neill and Arthur Miller, is considered among the three foremost playwrights of 20th-century American drama. After years of obscurity, at age 33 he became famous with the success of *The Glass Menagerie*, which closely reflected his own unhappy family background. It was the first of his successes, along with *A Streetcar Named Desire*, *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof*, *Sweet Bird of Youth* and *The Night of the Iguana*. Later he attempted a new style that didn't appeal as widely to audiences. Much of Williams' most acclaimed work has been adapted for the cinema. He also wrote short stories, poetry, essays and a volume of memoirs.

In 1969, America experienced one of its most extraordinary summers. In addition to the ongoing unrest revolving around the Vietnam War and Civil Rights, three pivotal milestones occurred: The Stonewall Riots, which marked the beginning of the modern LGBTQ era; the Apollo moon landing, which became the crowning achievement of a decade-long "Space Race" and Woodstock, probably the single most important cultural event of the era. The Whitney Biennial, a showcase of what’s new in American art, returns to the Whitney for its eighty-first installment in March 2024. It was introduced in 1932 by the Museum’s founder, Gertrude Vanderbilt Whitney, and is the longest-running exhibition of its kind. To date, more than 3,600 influential and innovative artists have participated in a Whitney Biennial or Annual. Professor Germano will present a visual lecture about the exhibit which runs through August 11, 2024.

The Sully Wing of the Louvre is our focus. This is where the Louvre began and we will trace its history, starting out as a fortress with dungeons below. The work of French artists, Georges de La Tour, Watteau, Fragonard, Claude Lorrain, Chardin and Ingres will be highlighted. The Tuileries Garden in all its wondrous splendor will be explored.

The Cloisters are part of the Metropolitan Museum of art, located in a separate, building in Fort Tryon Park. It resembles a European medieval monastery and integrates architectural elements from various structures in France and Spain. The enchanting cloister gardens are an important part of the museum. They are planted with culinary and medicinal plants, as well as those used for dyeing fabrics, specifically those used for the Unicorn Tapestries. There are many treasures in this collection, including paintings and sculptures, stained glass windows, illuminated books, carved ivory objects, enamels – all giving great insight into life during medieval times.

Covered Portraits of the Renaissance

An intriguing but unknown side of Renaissance painting: multisided portraits where the sitter’s likeness was concealed by hinges or sliding covers within a box, or a dual-faced format. The covers and reverses of these small portraits were adorned with puzzlelike emblems, epigrams, allegories and mythologies that celebrated the sitter’s character. The viewer had to decode the meaning of the symbolic portrait before lifting, sliding, or turning the image over to unmask the face below. Join Professor Germano when he presents a visual lecture related to this unique exhibition at the Metropolitan Museum of Art.


