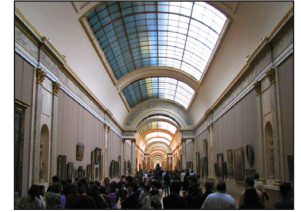

We will focus on American sonnets of the past two centuries, including Hart Crane's tribute to Emily Dickinson, Emma Lazarus's dedication of Lady Liberty to the world's tired and poor, as well as sonnets by Longfellow, Very, Tuckerman, Robinson, Frost, Stickney, Wylie and Millay. Here are our Petrarchs and Shakespeares, the American masters who, by living within the strictures of the octave and the sestet, found full voice, enlarged a tradition and changed the sonnet forever.
